MCAG Launches Measure V Website

Merced- Merced County Association of Governments (MCAG) has launched a new website to share information about the distribution of funds and the development of the implementation plan for Measure V, the half-cent transportation sales tax approved by voters in November 2016.

The website www.measurev-mcag.com will provide a breakdown of expenditures by local agency, as well as regional projects, transit investments and administration. It also includes detailed reports regarding revenue received by the agency and all meetings associated with the Measure V effort.

“We made a commitment to voters to ensure that Measure V funds are spent exactly as promised,” said Patrick Pittenger, MCAG Executive Director. “The website is just one element towards our goal of complete transparency in the implementation of Measure V.”

Visitors to the site can review the action of the Citizens Oversight Committee as well as the East and Westside Committees currently working to identify regional projects for funding. There is also a document library containing all relevant materials related to Measure V and a page where people can ask questions or comment on proposed expenditures.

“The site will be updated with new information as we move through this exciting time in local transportation planning,” added Pittenger. “We finally have the ability to fix our local roads.”
