

RESOLUTION 2017 – 12



A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DOS PALOS SETTING MEASURE V TRANSPORTATION SALE TAX FUNDED PRIORITY PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, City Councilmembers and staff drafted and placed a transportation sales tax measure on the November 8, 2016 ballot which was approved by 82.5% of the City’s voters; and

WHEREAS, the Measure V campaign committed to apply these funds toward the reconstruction of the City’s highest traffic and worst quality streets and sidewalks; and

WHEREAS, possible options, opinions, priorities, reports, and sources of funding have been considered at several meetings this year in preparation of the City’s priority, placement and application on local, regional, and statewide transportation programs; **NOW**,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Dos Palos does hereby:

Set its Focus as follows:

- A. Downtown Sidewalk Project to demonstrate the integrity of Measure V to our voters;
- B. Highest Traffic and Worst Quality Streets and Sidewalks near schools or areas with high community usage;
- C. Other Poorer Quality Streets and Sidewalks; and

Set its Strategies as follows:

- D. Reduce Expenses by bundling projects whenever possible, combining main streets with nearby feeders or collectors into one project, saving staging, labor, and equipment costs.
- E. Increase Funding with matching grants such as bike paths or congestion reduction funds where applicable, funding to cover the underground replacement of electric, telephone, cable, water, sewer, and storm drainage utilities, and apply for Regional funding specifically for Center Avenue and Blossom Street as arterials;
- F. Bond or borrow the first three to five years of sales tax revenue at no or low interest and repay from the revenue stream in conjunction with the county and other cities to reduce cost of issuance;
- G. Begin underground work ASAP to make surface projects shovel ready.

H. Stick to the plan, avoid changing priorities, and complete projects.

Set its Priority as follows:

4. Center Avenue South Area Project	360,000

7. Almond Avenue at the Cemetery Project	380,000
8. Virginia Avenue between Palo Alto & Valeria	390,000
9. Marks Subdivision (Mumby, Johnson, Jones, Geis)	400,000
10. Marguerite Street between Carol & Frank	500,000
