What is Measure V?

Measure V is a half-cent sales tax passed in November 2016 by Merced County voters. It is used for transportation maintenance and improvement projects in Merced County.

How long will Measure V last?

For 30 years, from April 1, 2017 to March 31, 2047.

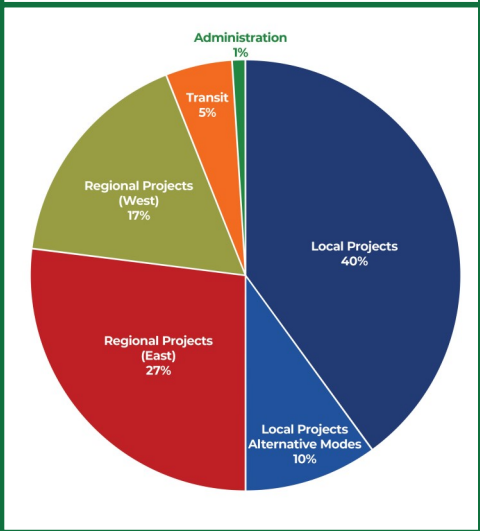
How much money has been collected so far?

There has been \$51,220,739 collected through December 31, 2019.

Who decides how the money will be spent?

- ◆ City Councils and the County Board of Supervisors decide how money for **Local Projects**, including **Alternative Modes**, is spent.
- ◆ Money for **Regional Projects** is recommended by the East and West side Regional Project Committees and approved by the MCAG Governing Board. These committees consist of local elected officials on the east and west side of the County.
- ◆ **Transit** funding is allocated by the MCAG Governing Board.
- ◆ **Administrative** monies are included in the annual MCAG budget recommended by the Executive Director and approved by the Governing Board.

Local voters decided how Measure V funds would be split up.



Is the money being used as intended?

- ◆ Yes! There are transportation projects being planned and constructed in every local jurisdiction in Merced County.
- ◆ The **Citizens Oversight Committee** meets quarterly to review expenditure reports and approve the annual audited financial statements every January.
- ◆ The annual report titled **On the move** is released every spring and includes both project and financial updates.
