

Request:

The City of Livingston (City) is seeking federal funds to be allocated to the TCP2- Arakelian Centralized Treatment Plant and Storage Tank Project. This project will positively impact the residents of the City of Livingston by improving the delivery of clean water to the populous.



TCP Treatment Facilities recently constructed at City of Livingston Well 16.

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The proposed project improvements include the construction of raw waterlines from Well Nos. 12, 13, & 17 to Arakelian Park where centralized 1,2,3 trichloropropane (TCP) removal facilities will be built to treat water from Well Nos. 12, 13, & 17. Additionally, a 1 million gallon treated water storage tank will be constructed.

Necessity:

The City of Livingston is currently categorized as a disadvantaged community. The City has a small amount of available resources and a limited tax base to use for funding. When possible, the City uses these funds to leverage other outside funding sources to complete projects.

Construction of the proposed project improvements will help to bring the City’s water system into compliance with TCP water quality requirements. The City in recent years has begun designing and constructing a number of water system improvement projects. The City strives to improve the quality of water provided to its customers through a variety of treatment and capacity increasing projects. This project is a demonstration of that

Funding request: \$14,000,000
